## Stamp Printing Methods

Reprinted below is the text of the introductory slide to the A.P.S. slide program entitled "Stamp Printing Methods," which Helvetia members saw at the October meeting. The slide program includes half a dozen Swiss stamps to illustrate some of the printing techniques. The most interesting Swiss stamp was the typographed franchise stamp showing Henri Dunant, founder of the Red Cross (Scott # S15). Usually in typography the background is cut away, leaving the lines of the design in relief. In the case of this stamp, however, the portrait design was cut out and the raised background was printed.

Printing Method	Recess	Relief	Plane
Line	Etching by hand Engraving by hand	Typograph	Lithograph (stone)
Screen	Photogravure (cross lined)	Photoengraving	Photolithograph (offset)
Grain	Photogravure  Melted rosin		Collotype (swollen gelatin)

Color Laydown	
1. Simple	Single color laid down in <u>one</u> impression
2. Sequent	Several colors laid down in the <u>same</u> impression
3. Separate	Several colors laid down as <u>separate</u> impressions in <u>different</u> areas, or superimposed in the same area so that one color blots out another without blending
4. Superimposed	Several colors laid down as <u>separate</u> impressions in the <u>same</u> area to yield other colors
